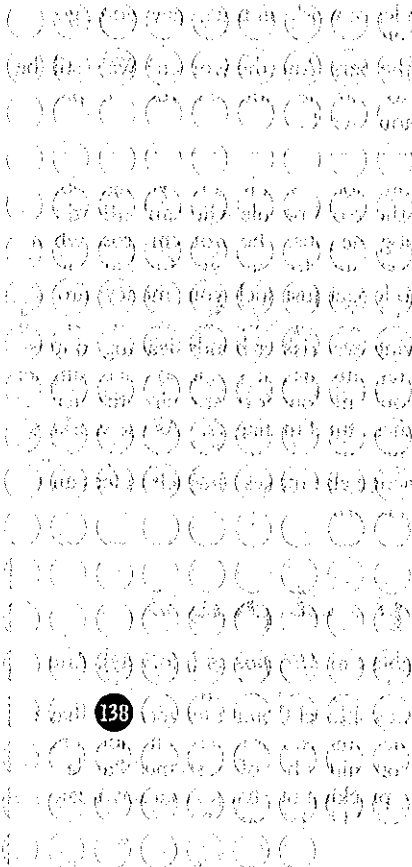

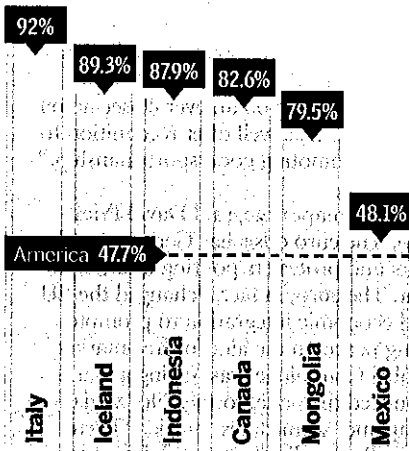

America's ranking among democratic countries in voter turnout — 138th out of 169

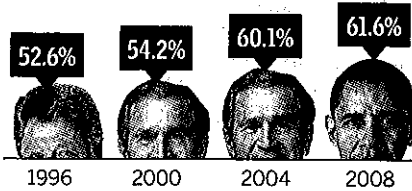


Six countries with higher turnout than the U.S. (average 1945-2001)



## THE 2008 TURNOUT

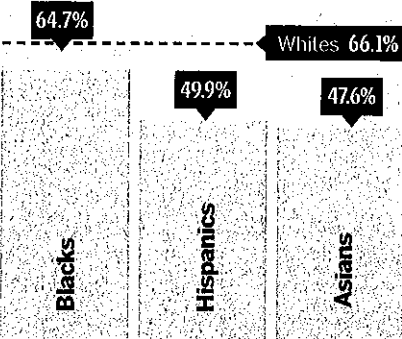
Barack Obama inspired unusually high voter turnout



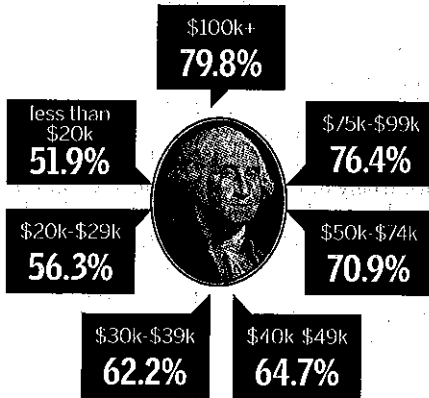
Women outvoted men



Whites outvoted minorities

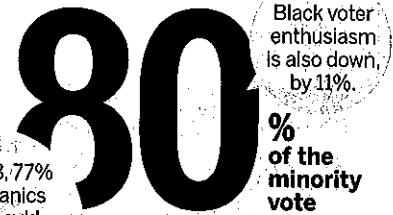


Higher-income Americans outvoted the poor



## THE 2012 MATH

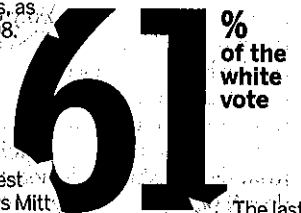
President Obama won in 2008 thanks to strong minority and youth turnout. Here's what he — and his GOP rival, Mitt Romney — respectively need to come out on top this November.



In 2008, 77% of Hispanics said they'd "definitely vote." This year: 64%.



That's assuming whites make up at least 74% of all voters, as in 2008.



The latest polling says Mitt has only locked up 53% of the white vote.

The last candidate to win 61% of the white vote? Reagan in 1984.
